#### ADVENTURE STORY:



**FAIRY TALES AND FOLK TALES BOOK.:**


Fairy tales are stories that are specifically for kids, involve magical characters, have good and evil characters, and generally start with “once upon a time.”


**FANTASY BOOKS:**


**CRIME BOOKS:**


#### HISTORICAL FICTION:

**FICTION BOOK:**


"Fiction" refers to **literature created from the imagination**. Mysteries, science fiction, romance, fantasy, chick lit, crime thrillers are all fiction genres
